

## Casualty Management in Specialist Rescue Course

### Code: YCMSR

The YCMSR is one of a number of courses that contribute to the Diploma in Specialist Rescue, the Diploma is validated by the Centre for Disaster Management at Coventry University. The Fire Service College works in partnership with Outreach Rescue to provide a wide range of opportunities to develop key specialist skills for operational staff.

#### Who should attend

The module is designed for those with specialist rescue responsibilities involved in casualty management from point of contact to handing over to specialist medical care.

#### Course/Programme Requirements

- Experience in one or more areas of specialist rescue.
- Be fit for full operational duties in accordance with FRS requirements for this role.
- Have received formal training in Health and Safety at Work, including manual handling.

The module will involve students undertaking potentially strenuous training.

Personal equipment should include appropriate all weather outdoor clothing, footwear and gloves. All specialist equipment required is provided with the exception of gloves suitable for rope rescue. Service uniform is not required.

#### Contact Outreach Rescue for further information including detailed course content, assessment process and progression notes.

All course nominations must be followed by a declaration of conformity with the above from their organisation. This course provides a First Person on Scene Intermediate qualification.

#### Aim

To address the need for improved casualty management from point of contact to the handing over to specialist medical care. The module is aimed at directing and enhancing skills towards the specific issues found in a variety of specialist rescue situations.

#### Outcomes

After successful completion of the course, the student will have a firm foundation of knowledge and skills and should be able to:

- Practise casualty assessment, packaging and movement.
- Examine casualty management issues in a variety of technical access situations.
- Assess the principal demands of a range of systems of Rope and Water Rescue and their impact on casualty management.

- Apply the fundamental requirements of Health and Safety as it applies to specialist rescue.
- Apply general risk assessment processes.
- Demonstrate the ability to work within a specialist team.

#### Delivery Method

By lecture, practical exercises and scenarios. A course manual is issued

#### Assessment/Certification/Accreditation

Core course content is assessed by a combination of continuous, scenario based, verbal and written assessment to inform the student's development indicators. Results centrally recorded and entered in a personal Record of Performance.

Delivery and Assessment of the casualty handling element is in accordance with the First Person on Scene (FPOS) Intermediate level programme.

**Candidates will receive an FPOS Certificate valid for 3 years** as well as joint Fire Service College and Outreach Rescue certification on successful completion of the course, together with Edexcel /FPOS certificate valid for 3 years.
