

Management of Search Operations for Land and Water Incidents Course

Code: YMSOLWI

The YMSOLWI is one of a number of courses that contribute to the Diploma in Specialist Rescue, the Diploma is validated by the Centre for Disaster Management at Coventry University. The Fire Service College works in partnership with Outreach Rescue to provide a wide range of opportunities to develop key specialist skills for operational staff.

Who should attend

Emergency Services personnel who are or may be involved in the management of search incidents.

Course/Programme Requirements

- Be fit for full operational duties in accordance with your organisation's requirements for this role.
- Have received formal training in Health and Safety at Work, including manual handling.

The module will involve students undertaking potentially strenuous training.

Personal equipment should include appropriate all weather outdoor clothing, footwear and gloves. All specialist equipment required is provided. Service uniform is not required.

Aim

To enable those who have responsibility in management of search operations for land and water incidents to broaden their understanding of search management concepts, practices and field skills.

Outcomes

After successful completion of the course, the student will have a firm foundation of knowledge and should be able to:

- Undertake assessment of the needs of a search incident response.
- Illustrate how statistical analysis, and missing person behaviour, developed from a basic knowledge, can be used to support models for establishing search areas and the probability of a person being in the search area.
- Assess and apply the requirements for managing resources and liaison with other agencies.
- Demonstrate an understanding of the requirements for managing recovery procedures and casualty evacuation.
- Demonstrate the ability to work within a team and apply the principles of team development processes.

- Examine the management requirements of Search Operations.

Delivery Method

By lectures, workshops and practical exercises. Course notes will be issued.

Assessment/Certification/Accreditation

Core course content is assessed by a combination of continuous, scenario based and written assessment to inform the student's development indicators. Results centrally recorded and entered in a personal Record of Performance.

Students will receive joint Fire Service College and Outreach Rescue Certification upon successful completion of the course
