

Rope Rescue Level One Operator Instructor Skills Course

Code: YRIS

The YRIS is one of a number of courses that contribute to the Diploma in Specialist Rescue, the Diploma is validated by the Centre for Disaster Management at Coventry University. The Fire Service College works in partnership with Outreach Rescue to provide a wide range of opportunities to develop key specialist skills for operational staff.

Who should attend

Emergency Services personnel who may be called upon to train personnel at a level equivalent to the Outreach Rope Rescue Level One Operator's programme.

Course/Programme Requirements

- Satisfactory completion of the Outreach 'Rope Rescue Supervisor' course (or Reassessment course) within the previous 2 years with verified maintenance of those skills.
- Compliance with Outreach Training Progression Policy.
- Be fit for full operational duties in accordance with FRS requirements for this role.
- Have received formal training in Health and Safety at Work, including manual handling.

The module will involve students undertaking potentially strenuous training.

Personal equipment should include appropriate all weather outdoor clothing, footwear and gloves. All specialist equipment required is provided with the exception of gloves suitable for rope rescue. Service uniform is not required.

All course nominations must be followed by a declaration of conformity with the above from their organisation.

Aim

To provide the framework of instructional skills and associated knowledge and understanding to instruct others in the equivalent of the Outreach Rope Rescue Operator core skills.

Outcomes

After successful completion of the course, the student will have a firm foundation of knowledge and skills and should be able to:

- Demonstrate the ability to plan, deliver, assess and review training events across a range of environments covering topics within the Outreach Rope Rescue One Operator syllabus.
- Undertake risk assessments for delivering the above in a range of teaching environments.
- Apply knowledge of rescue PPE equipment as to its use, care and maintenance.
- Understand skills maintenance and development issues.

- Supervise response to a range of rope rescue situations.
- Practise a range of teaching and assessment methods suitable for a range of candidates' abilities.

Delivery Method

By lectures, practical exercises and scenarios. A course manual is issued.

Assessment/Certification/Accreditation

Core course content is assessed by a combination of continuous, scenario based and written assessment to inform the student's development indicators. Results centrally recorded and entered in a personal Rope Rescue Record of Performance.

Students must then be supervised during a development phase prior to final work-based (or other) assessment and full deployment. It is strongly recommended that a reassessment course is attended within 2 years of completion of this course. It is a requirement that adequate skills maintenance training will have been undertaken in the interim period.
