

Rope Rescue Level Two Supervisor Reassessment Course Code: YRR3DR

Who should attend

Emergency Services personnel who require reassessment as an Outreach Rope Rescue Supervisor.

Course/Programme Requirements

- Students must have successfully completed the Outreach Rope Rescue Supervisor's Course (or a Reassessment course) within the previous 2 years with verified maintenance of those skills.
- Compliance with Outreach Training Progression Policy.
- Be fit for full operational duties in accordance with FRS requirements for this role.
- Have received formal training in Health and Safety at Work, including manual handling.

The module will involve students undertaking potentially strenuous training.

Personal equipment should include appropriate all weather outdoor clothing, footwear and gloves. All specialist equipment required is provided with the exception of gloves suitable for rope rescue. Service uniform is not required.

Contact Outreach Rescue for further information including detailed course content, assessment process and progression notes.

All course nominations must be followed by a declaration of conformity with the above from their organisation.

Aim

To reassess students in all the core skills of the Outreach Rope Rescue Supervisor programme.

Outcomes

After successful completion of the course the student will have a firm foundation of knowledge and skills and should be able to:

- Apply advanced knowledge of a range of rescue equipment as to its use, care and application.
- Practise risk assessment principles.
- Supervise a range of technical rescues requiring the use of rope access techniques.
- Demonstrate the ability to assess and analyse a range of complex rescue situations and design suitable rescue solutions.
- Assess the principal requirements of Health and Safety as applied to rope rescue situations including continuation training and skills' maintenance issues.

Delivery Method

By lectures, practical exercises and scenarios. A course manual is issued.

Assessment/Certification/Accreditation

A continuous assessment is made in addition to a practical and written unseen test to inform the student's development indicators. Results centrally recorded and entered in a personal Rope Rescue Record of Performance.

Students will receive joint Fire Service College and Outreach Rescue Certification upon successful completion of the course. It is strongly recommended that a reassessment course is attended within 2 years of completion of this course and that adequate skills' maintenance training will have been undertaken in the interim period.
