

Rope Rescue Level One Operator Course

Code: YRRO

The YRRO is one of a number of courses that contribute to the Diploma in Specialist Rescue, the Diploma is validated by the Centre for Disaster Management at Coventry University. The Fire Service College works in partnership with Outreach Rescue to provide a wide range of opportunities to develop key specialist skills for operational staff.

Who should attend

Emergency Services personnel who are or may be involved with rope rescue, at operator level.

Course/Programme Requirements

Owing to the nature of the training, students must:

- Be fit for full operational duties in accordance with FRS requirements for this role.
- Have an indicated aptitude for working at heights.
- Have received formal training in Health and Safety at Work, including manual handling.

The module will involve students undertaking potentially strenuous training.

Personal equipment should include appropriate all weather outdoor clothing and footwear. All specialist equipment required is provided with the exception of gloves suitable for rope rescue. Service uniform is not required.

Aim

To enable students to act as competent, supervised operatives in rope rescue situations.

Outcomes

After successful completion of the course, the student will have a firm foundation of knowledge and skills and should be able to:

- Apply knowledge of rescue equipment as to its use, care, application and maintenance.
- Assess hazards associated with the operation of rope rescue systems and create appropriate responses.
- Demonstrate understanding of the requirements of Health and Safety as applied to rope rescue situations including basic casualty care and skills maintenance.
- Practice safe application of –

A range of technical rescue equipment and its application within the fundamental systems for rescue and twin line working.

Delivery Method

By lectures, practical exercises and scenarios. A course manual is issued.

Assessment/Certification/Accreditation

Core course content is assessed by a combination of continuous, scenario based and written assessment to inform the student's development indicators. Results centrally recorded and entered in a personal Rope Rescue Record of Performance.

Students will receive joint Fire Service College and Outreach Rescue Certification upon successful completion of the course.
