

Specialist Rescue – Technical knowledge and its application for Middle Managers

Code: YSREOA

The YSREOA is one of a number of courses that contribute to the Diploma in Specialist Rescue, the Diploma is validated by the Centre for Disaster Management at Coventry University. The Fire Service College works in partnership with Outreach Rescue to provide a wide range of opportunities to develop key specialist skills for operational staff.

Who should attend

Members of the emergency services, NGOs or collaborating agencies whose role requires them to manage incidents involving Specialist Rescue issues and resources. *This course does not provide a technical qualification in any of the specialist rescue disciplines.*

Course/Programme Requirements

Owing to the nature of the training, students must:

- Be fit for full operational duties in accordance with your organisation's requirements for this role.
- Have received formal training in Health and Safety at Work, including manual handling.

The module will involve students undertaking potentially strenuous training.

Personal equipment should include appropriate all weather outdoor clothing, footwear and gloves. All specialist equipment required is provided. Service uniform is not required.

Aim

To provide increased understanding and underpinning knowledge of specialist rescue to nominated managing Officers. All candidates will be given the opportunity to experience practical rope, water, confined space and casualty management situations within specialist rescue environments.

Outcomes

After successful completion of the course, the students will have a firm foundation of knowledge and should be able to:

- Analyse a range of the operational considerations and incident command issues that are influenced by technical demands associated with :
 - Safe Working At Height, First Response and Rope Rescue
 - Water rescue
 - Flood response
 - Confined space
 - Casualty management
 - Wide area search

- Examine the principal equipment selection issues and standards including the appropriate legislative frameworks and approved codes of practice.
- Assess broad training requirements and their implications for effective team operations.
- Demonstrate understanding of the physical environment relating to specialist rescue and the limitations this may present.
- Examine skills maintenance and development issues.

Delivery Method

By lectures, workshops, demonstrations and field exercises. Course notes will be issued.

Assessment/Certification/Accreditation

Assessment is by means of a series of written reports produced during the course. Results centrally recorded.

Students will receive a joint Fire Service College and Outreach Rescue certificate of attendance upon successful completion of the course.
