

RESCUE CRAFT PADDLING - INSTRUCTOR

Who should attend?

Emergency Services and other responders involved in the delivery of training for those using paddled rescue craft.

Course/Programme Requirements

- Owing to the nature of the training, students must be fit for full operational duties in accordance with their organisation's requirements
- Students should bring appropriate all-weather outdoor clothing and footwear. All specialist equipment and PPE is provided
- To successfully complete the course, students must have previously completed DEFRA module 3 Water Technician Instructor

Aim

To provide the knowledge and skills to manage training involving rescue skills and simulations using rescue rafts and sleds.

Outcomes

After successful completion of the course, the student will be able to

- Assess and manage risks in training venues
- · Retrieve students/craft in difficulty
- Explain and demonstrate a variety of paddle strokes
- Explain and demonstrate manoeuvres in flat, Grade 1 and Grade 2 conditions using rescue sleds and rafts
- Assess student performance in paddling skills and manoeuvres
- Run capsize training sessions with sleds and rafts

Delivery Method

Training is delivered via predominantly practical sessions at Outreach venues

Assessment/Certification/Accreditation

Core course content is assessed by practical assessment throughout the course; results centrally recorded.

Students will receive Outreach Rescue Certification upon successful completion of the course.
