

# Direct Emergency Rescue and Recovery of Casualties from Confined Spaces

## City & Guilds Level 3 Award 6160-07

### Who Should Attend:

This unit is for anyone who directs the activities of a team for rescue or recovery in confined spaces. This may include rescue team leader, coordinator, entry controller/top person or supervisor in relation to rescue and recovery of casualties, planning and preparing for emergency operations, mobilising rescue teams, directing and monitoring rescue activities, reporting and securing sites after incidents or emergencies.

### Pre-Requisites or APL:

- ✦ High Risk Confined Space Entry award (City & Guilds 6160-03 or equivalent 3 day training)
- ✦ Member of a Rescue and Recovery Team (City & Guilds 6160-08 or equivalent 3 day training)
- ✦ At least one of the above must have been renewed or gained within the last 3 years

### Requirements:

- ✦ Aptitude for difficult work in confined spaces
- ✦ Fit for operational duties
- ✦ Physical fitness for strenuous training
- ✦ Clean shaven each morning of training

### Aim:

The aim of this unit is to reflect the national occupational standard for directing emergency rescue and recovery of casualties from confined spaces. This unit covers both the water and non-water industry areas.

### Outcomes:

On successful completion of the course, the student will have demonstrated their competence, knowledge and skills enabling them to meet the City & Guilds requirements to:

- ✦ Plan and prepare emergency operations for rescue team
- ✦ Mobilise a rescue team and direct entry and exit to the confined space
- ✦ Monitor a rescue team to ensure procedures are followed
- ✦ Understand the principles of working as rescue team leader
- ✦ Understand rescue team leader duties and responsibilities

### Compliance:

- ✦ Confined Space Regulations 1997
- ✦ National Occupational Standards for Working in Confined Spaces – EUSS07

### Duration:

1 day with 8 hours contact time

### Ratios:

Trainers 1:6 Students (assistant trainer joins for scenario based exercises where necessary)

### Delivery Method:

Lectures, classroom work, practical sessions, scenarios.

### Equipment:

Specialist equipment and PPE is included. You can provide your own PPE provided it is serviceable and subject to inspection by our trainers.

You are expected to bring the following:

Overalls, Safety boots (non-slip, toe capped), Gloves (can be provided), Comfortable and suitably warm & weatherproof clothing.

### Assessment:

Course content is assessed by a combination of direct observations of set tasks, question and answer, a short answer externally set exam and scenario based assessment. Individual feedback is provided.

### Certification:

This course can be certified by City & Guilds or by Outreach Rescue upon meeting the assessment criteria. For City & Guilds certification, there is an additional fee of £45, and printed certificates are provided. There is no additional fee for digital Outreach Certification, and results are recorded on the Outreach Rescue Database.

Certification is valid for 3 years.

### Progression:

Recertification is recommended every 3 years.

This course is not a prerequisite for any higher awards in Confined Space working.
