

Rope Rescue Instructor Assess / Reassess

Who Should Attend:

Personnel who have consolidated the learning on the Rope Rescue Instructor Training and are ready for assessment **OR** personnel needing to recertify as a Rope Rescue Instructor if approaching expiration of existing award.

(For supervision of operational rope rescue outside of a training environment, the Rope Rescue Supervisors Award is also required)

Pre-Requisites or APL:

Completed the Rope Rescue Instructor Training withing the last 2 years

OR

- Hold an in-date Rope Rescue Instructor award AND have verified records of skills maintenance
- Rope Rescue Supervisor (desirable, all attendees)

Requirements:

- Aptitude for training others
- Consolidated learning following the Rope Rescue Instructor training OR consolidated experience of operating as a Rope Rescue Instructor
- Consolidated experience of operating as a Rope Rescue Supervisor (desirable)
- Fit for operational duties
- Physical fitness for potentially strenuous training

Aim:

To establish the students competence in the delivery of quality training at the level of the Rope Rescue Operator award.

Outcomes:

On successful completion of the course, the student will have demonstrated their competence, knowledge and skills enabling them to:

- Demonstrate the ability to plan, deliver, assess, and review training events across a range of environments, covering topics within the Safe Work at Height and Rope Rescue Operator syllabus
- Undertake Risk Assessments and Rescue Plans for delivering the above in a range of teaching environments (built and natural)
- Understand skills maintenance and development issues
- Apply knowledge of rescue PPE equipment, its use, care and maintenance
- Rescue students in difficulty
- Practise different teaching and assessment methods suitable for a range of candidates' abilities

Duration:

3 days with 21 hours contact time

Ratios:

Trainers 1:6 Students

Delivery Method:

Lectures, classroom work and practical sessions.

Equipment:

Specialist equipment and PPE is included. You can provide your own PPE provided it is serviceable subject to inspection by our trainers.

Clothing suitable for working outdoors in all weather will be required, as well as gloves suitable for rope work.

Assessment:

Course content is assessed by a combination of direct observations of session delivery and personal skill sets, written tasks and a written exam.

Certification:

Students will receive a digital Outreach Rescue certificate of achievement upon meeting assessment criteria. Results are recorded on a personal record of performance and recorded on the Outreach Rescue Database.

Certification is valid for 3 years.

Progression:

Recertification is recommended every 2 years.

Completion of this assessment and attendance of the prior training at Outreach Rescue satisfies module 'Specialist Rescue Instructor (5087EXQ)' for the Diploma in Specialist Rescue and is worth 50 credits.
