

Rope Rescue Instructor Training

Who Should Attend:

Emergency Services personnel and personnel from organisations who wish to deliver and supervise training within the scope of the Safe Work at Height and Rope Rescue Operator awards.

(For supervision of operational rope rescue outside of a training environment, the Rope Rescue Supervisors Award is also required)

Pre-Requisites or APL:

- In-date Safe Work at Height and Rope Rescue Operator award
- Rope Rescue Supervisor (desirable)

Requirements:

- Indicated aptitude for training others
- Consolidated experience of operating at a high standard as a SWAH and Rope Rescue Operator
- Consolidated experience of operating as a Rope Rescue Supervisor (desirable)
- Fit for operational duties
- Physical fitness for potentially strenuous training

Aim:

To provide the framework of instructional skills and associated knowledge to instruct others in the equivalent of the Safe Work at Height and Rope Rescue Operator.

Outcomes:

On successful completion of the course, the student will have the knowledge and skills to:

- Demonstrate the ability to plan, deliver, assess, and review training events across a range of environments, covering topics within the Safe Work at Height and Rope Rescue Operator syllabus
- Undertake Risk Assessments and Rescue Plans for delivering the above in a range of teaching environments (built and natural)
- Understand skills maintenance and development issues
- Apply knowledge of rescue PPE equipment, its use, care and maintenance
- Rescue students in difficulty
- Practise different teaching and assessment methods suitable for a range of candidates' abilities

Compliance:

- Work at Height Regulations
- LOLER
- PUWER

Duration:

5 days with 36 hours contact time

Ratios:

Trainers 1:6 Students

Delivery Method:

Lectures, classroom work, practical sessions and scenario based training. A course manual is issued.

Equipment:

Specialist equipment and PPE is included. You can provide your own PPE provided it is serviceable subject to inspection by our trainers.

Clothing suitable for working outdoors in all weather will be required, as well as gloves suitable for rope work.

Assessment:

The assessment for this award is separate to allow for consolidation post training.

Certification:

A certificate of attendance is provided. To qualify as an instructor delegates must return for the Rope Rescue Instructor Assessment/ Reassessment course (3 days)

Progression:

Students should attend the Rope Rescue Instructor Assessment/Reassessment within 2 years.

Completion of this training **and** subsequent assessment at Outreach Rescue satisfies module 'Specialist Rescue Instructor (5087EXQ)' for the Diploma in Specialist Rescue and is worth 50 credits.
