

Rope Rescue Supervisor

Training and Assessment Combined

Who Should Attend:

Emergency Services personnel and personnel from organisations who are required to supervise operational work at height and rope rescue situations. It is recommended that all SWAH and Rope Rescue Operators have a supervisor present when operational. (For the supervision of training activities, the Rope Rescue Instructors award is required)

Pre-Requisites or APL:

- ✧ In-date SWAH and Rope Rescue Operator or equivalent

Requirements:

- ✧ Consolidated experience of operating at the SWAH and Rope Operator level
- ✧ Fit for operational duties
- ✧ Physical fitness for potentially strenuous training

Aim:

To further develop the skillsets of the SWAH and Rope Rescue Operator, by introduction of further techniques and systems, and to equip students with the necessary skillsets to oversee and supervise rope rescue operations.

Outcomes:

On successful completion of the course, the student will have the knowledge and skills to:

- ✧ Apply knowledge of rescue equipment; use, care, application and maintenance
- ✧ Apply advanced knowledge of a range of rescue equipment, its use, care and application
- ✧ Write and use Risk Assessments and Rescue Plans
- ✧ Supervise a range of technical rescues requiring the use of rope access techniques
- ✧ Demonstrate the ability to assess and analyse a range of rescue situations and design suitable solutions
- ✧ Apply requirements of Health and Safety and principles of Work at Height Hierarchy as applied to work at height and rope rescues

- ✧ BS 8454
- ✧ Work at Height Regulations
- ✧ LOLER
- ✧ PUWER

Duration:

5 days with 36 hours contact time

Trainers 1:6 Students

Delivery Method:

Lectures, classroom work, practical sessions and scenario based training. A course manual is issued.

Equipment:

Specialist equipment and PPE is included. You can provide your own PPE provided it is serviceable subject to inspection by our trainers.

Clothing suitable for working outdoors in all weather will be required, as well as gloves suitable for rope work.

Assessment:

Course content is assessed by a combination of direct observations of set tasks, question and answer, written/multi choice exams, written works and scenario-based assessment. Individual feedback is provided.

Certification:

Students will receive a digital Outreach Rescue certificate of achievement upon meeting assessment criteria. Results are recorded on a personal record of performance and recorded on the Outreach Rescue Database.

Certification is valid for 3 years.

Progression:

Recertification & Refresher training is recommended every 2 years.
