

Rescue from Vehicles in Water Instructor (2 days)

Who Should Attend:

Emergency Services, Search and Rescue personnel and personnel from organisations involved in the delivery of training for those engaged in rescues from vehicles in water.

This course can be delivered exclusively for MOD 2 Instructors, or for MOD 3 Instructors (but not mixed).

Pre-Requisites or APL:

- In-date DEFRA MOD 2 or 3 Instructors Award
- Have attended the Rescue from Vehicles in Water training course

Requirements:

- Indicated aptitude for working near and in water
- Fit for operational duties

Aim:

To provide the knowledge and skills to manage training involving rescue simulations from vehicles in water.

Outcomes:

After successful completion of the course, the student will have a firm foundation of knowledge and should be able to:

- Manage risks and organise facilities in artificial swift-water venues.
- Install vehicles in different orientations.
- Manage training in vehicle rope stabilisation.
- Manage learning associated with vehicle behaviour in water.
- Manage learning in relation to casualty issues associated with vehicle rescues.
- Manage wade rescues including use of hand-held sleds.
- Manage swim-based rescue simulations (for MOD 3 instructors).
- Manage craft-based "buoyant" rescue simulations (for MOD 3 instructors).
- Manage scenario-based training with multiple casualties from vehicles.

Duration:

2 days (15 hours)

Ratios:

Trainers 1:6 Students

Delivery Method:

Lectures, classroom work, practical sessions and scenario based training at a suitable venue allowing water access for vehicles.

Equipment:

Specialist equipment and PPE is included. You can provide your own PPE provided it is serviceable subject to inspection by our trainers.

Assessment:

Course content is assessed by a combination of direct observations of set tasks, question and answer and scenario-based assessment. Individual feedback is provided.

Certification:

Students will receive a digital Outreach Rescue certificate of achievement upon meeting assessment criteria. Results are recorded on a personal record of performance and recorded on the Outreach Rescue Database.

Certification is valid for 3 years.

Progression:

Reassessment & Refresher training is recommended every 2/3 years by means or reattending this course.

Venue:

This course can be run at venues that have access to a vehicle in variable water flow, usually this will be Cardiff, Lee Valley or Glasgow.
