

Water Rescue Technician Instructor Training (Mod 3 Level)

Who Should Attend:

Experienced and proficient Mod 3 award holders who wish to train personnel in the skillsets of the Water Rescue Technician (Mod 3).

Pre-Requisites or APL:

- In-date Mod 3 compliant award
- Advanced First Aid Award (compliant with DEFRA Con-Ops Annex F)

Requirements:

- Fit for operational duties
- Aptitude for training others
- Operational knowledge of operating as a Water Rescue Technician
- Working knowledge of the DEFRA Flood Rescue Concept of Operations and/or NFCC RBC

Aim:

To provide the framework of instructional skills and associated knowledge and understanding to instruct others in the skillsets of DEFRA Mod 3.

Outcomes:

Demonstrate as required skills to a high level within the Mod 3 standard:

- Water rescue scene management and dynamic assessment of risk.
- Understand the limitations of the role, rescue team & organisation.
- Working knowledge of all the Defra water & flood modules

Training design and delivery:

- Lesson Planning
- Scenario implementation
- Introducing subjects, principles and procedures
- Subjects in logical sequence
- Coaching complex skills
- Training venue assessment
- Group maintenance/management
- Goal setting for varying levels of ability

Reviews/Assessment:

- Run task reviews/question-and-answer sessions
- Assess practical/team/command skills
- Deliver feedback (group/individual)
- Use of multiple methods of assessment
- Maximise learning from scenarios and training sessions

Safety considerations:

- Establishing and monitoring safe systems
- Dynamic risk assessment of activities and venues
- Written generic risk assessment activities and venues
- Rescue students in difficulty

Evaluate complex scenarios:

- Convey logical progressions of response
- Convey command and control/multi-agency issues
- Convey permutations of rescue systems/ resources/ environments

Compliance:

- DEFRA Mod 3 Instructor
- NFCC Rescue Boat Code Mod 3 Instructor

Duration:

5 days with 34 hours contact time

Ratios:

Trainers 2:7 Students

Delivery Method:

Lectures, classroom work, practical sessions and scenario-based training. A course manual is issued.

Equipment:

Specialist equipment and PPE is included if required. Provision of your own suitable equipment at this level of award is advisable for familiarity purposes.

Assessment:

The assessment for this award is separate to allow for consolidation post-training. Individual feedback is provided.

Certification:

A certificate of attendance is provided. To qualify as an instructor, students must return for the Water Rescue Technician Instructor Assessment/Reassessment.

Progression:

Students should attend the Water Rescue Technician Instructor Assessment/Reassessment within 2 years. Completion of this training **and** subsequent assessment at Outreach Rescue satisfies module 'Specialist Rescue Instructor (5087EXQ)' for the Diploma in Specialist Rescue and is worth 50 credits.
